

Buenos Aires Project: Safety Mapping for Women's Mobility in BRT Corridor: La Matanza

Safetipin in collaboration with the World Bank commenced its work in Buenos Aires, Argentina in June 2020. The project focuses on a 10km stretch of a BRT corridor in the Greater Buenos Aires Region. One of the primary objectives of this project is to assess and analyse key parameters that impact accessibility and inclusion in public spaces using Safetipin applications.

Safetipin submitted the project Methodology/ Inception report to the World Bank which comprehensively draws out the envisioned project plan with objectives, methodology, proposed tools and a detailed work plan.

In the next phase of the project, we will build and design our tools for data collection in and around the upcoming La Matanza BRT corridor.
