Using Safetipin Tools to make Durban Safer

In Durban, data collection using My Safetipin App has begun in two localities of KwaMashu and KwaNdengezi by volunteers of Gugu Dlamini Foundation and Ethembeni Crisis Centre respectively. Additional data will be collected on Taxi Ranks using Safetipin Site app, a newly developed application. This app is used to collect specific information in public spaces on custom-built questionnaires. The female volunteers would assess the taxi ranks in terms of women's safety and

accessibility. This data would then be shared with our partners Soul City Insitute and the project stakeholders; National Taxi Association, SA and eThekwini Municipality to work on creating safe transport for women.



Mapping Safety in Malaysia with Safetipin Tools

In collaboration with Think City organisation, Safetipin will begin mapping in Greater Johor Bahru area using Safetipin Nite app. In addition to image collection, information on prominent public spaces will be collected through questionnaires. Hosted on Safetipin Site App, the questionnaire will be developed to assess accessibility, safety and inclusion at selected public spaces.

Presenting at World Bank Webinar

Safetipin presented our work on safe mobility for women at an event organised by World Bank in Bogota on Women's Safety in Public Transport. As all events are now online, we participated virtually sharing how Safetipin tools have been used to measure women's safety and access to mobility, focusing on some cities where safety audits have been conducted including Delhi, Hanoi and Colombo.
