'Building Gender Responsive Urban Spaces and Services' webinar

The webinar titled 'Building Gender Responsive Urban Spaces and Services' organised by Studio INHAF was held in collaboration with King's College London, Rethinking Cities 14 and Safetipin. The panel, moderated by Kalpana Viswanath, had expert speakers who discussed and explained the ways of incorporating gender in all existing spaces. There conversation started with understanding the impact of gender and other exclusions, continued by a conceptual understanding of inequalities



in a city. This was followed by understanding different spaces including economic, digital and public and then moved onto the work in the informal sector. We then looked at how art can be used to think about a city and ended with addresing the importance and role of data to make a difference.

Introducing Indicators for an Inclusive City at UTC 5.0



The Urban Thinkers Campus 5.0 was a 2 day event leading up to World Habitat Day to get expert and citizen inputs on how to create inclusive cities. One the first day, experts spoke about inclusive cities for women, children, LGBTQ+ and people with disabilities. Kalpana Viswanath and Rwitee Mandal from Safetipin presented the indicators for an inclusive city as in our report, "Guidelines for an Index on Gender Inclusive Cities." Based on their presentation, the

discussion on inclusive cities was taken forward in the breakout sessions. This event was organised by Safecity and Red Dot Foundation in collaboration with NIUA, the Urban Vision, Government of Catalonia and Safetipin.

Safetipin in Johor Bahru, Malaysia

In collaboration with the organisation Think City, Safetipin will begin mapping in Greater Johor Bahru area using the Safetipin Nite app. In addition to image collection, information on prominent public spaces will be collected through questionnaires. Hosted on the Safetipin Site App, the questionnaire will be developed to assess accessibility, safety and inclusion at selected public spaces.

Presentation at Institute of Home Economics, Delhi

Ankita from our team had an Interactive session with final year students of the Home Science department from the Institute of Home Economics (IHE), Delhi. The session focused on understanding the need of gender mainstreaming in urban planning. Travel needs and mobility patterns of diverse groups was discussed along with important elements of an inclusive public



space. The Safetipin methodology, analysis and impact was discussed which led to engaging conversations about safety. As a next step, the students will be using the My Safetipin App near their homes to conduct safety audits.
