World Urban Forum 11

The World Urban Forum (WUF) is the premier global conference on sustainable urbanization convened by the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat). The WUF was established in 2001 by the United Nations and is held every two years. This year the 11th session of WUF will be held in Katowice, Poland from 26-30 June 2022. Panel Discussion at the NIUA Pavilion: Building Capacities for Universally Accessible and Inclusive Cities - June 27, 14:00-15:00 CET

At WUF, NIUA is collaborating with the All India Institute of Local Self Government (AIILSG) to host a session on 'Building Capacities for Universally Accessible and Inclusive Cities.'

The session will discuss the need for training and capacity building in designing universally accessible and 'Inclusive for ALL' cities. Further, it will discuss the learning of the ongoing training programs under the BASIIC program in collaboration with various partners and stakeholders.



Urban Library: Shaping the Future of Mobility - Data Governance for Sustainable Development - **June 28, 14:15-15:15 CET**

In the Global South, detailed data on movement patterns and mobility exist but are often not accessible to decision-makers and cities lack the know-how to use them correctly. This session is organized as a collaboration between CAF - Development Bank of Latin America and TUMI – Transformative Urban Mobility Initiative and aims to provide an overview of the data ecosystem, its stakeholders, processes, and governance in Latin America.

Networking Event: Using Technology and Data for Livable Cities - Think City - June 29, 16:30-18:00 CET

Think City, a social purpose organization based in Malaysia in collaboration with Safetipin, undertook a pilot project on using data to make cities resilient, liveable, and inclusive in two cities of Malaysia, namely Johor Bahru and Kuala Lumpur in 2020 and 2021, respectively.

This session introduces the tools and the metrics developed for assessing the public space in Malaysia. The project report will be launched at this event, along with a brief presentation on key findings of the public spaces from both cities. There will be a panel discussion involving the speakers who will discuss Technology for Livable Cities, including how the data is crucial to building equitable, resilient, and liveable cities.

The presenters will share the main motivations for the development of the methodology, the variables for its application, the way in which they use the information for decision making, and the impact it has had in the contexts. This session specifically contributes to the SDG target 11.7, which aims to "provide universal access to safe, inclusive and accessible, green and public spaces, in particular for women and children, older persons and persons with disabilities". TUMI Transformative Urban Mobility Initiative 2022 - "Feminist Infrastructure – the Future of Inclusive Mobility"



The International Transport Forum organized various plenaries and workshops over the three days of May 18-20 this year to share initiatives and innovations, discuss challenges and discover solutions in the transportation sector. As a part of the event, TUMI (Transformative Urban Mobility Initiative) organized a day-long event on the 17th of May focusing on Transforming Transport Infrastructure that began with a session titled "Feminist Infrastructure – the Future of Inclusive Mobility."

Kalpana Viswanath from Safetipin was invited to the conference, where she shared her insights on gender being one axis in the inequitable world, and how economic deprivation and digital inequality must be continually addressed. IUDX Workshop Event - Using data to build Gender-Friendly Cities

On 27th May 2022, India Urban Data Exchange (IUDX) organized a session discussing 'Using data to build Gender-Friendly Cities' in their workshop series. The event focused on how data and technology can be deployed for making our cities safer and gender-friendly, in a world where cities are often designed, planned, and managed without the input and perspective of the diversity of people who live in them.

Kalpana Viswanath from Safetipin presented at the event and discussed how women (especially from vulnerable groups) are constrained by fear, violence, and inequitable social norms and the key role that data can play in providing evidence as well as a roadmap for change. She discussed the diverse projects Safetipin has worked on in various cities by harnessing technology as an enabler for making cities more gender-inclusive and equitable.



EFUS Event - How can digital tools make cities safer and enhance social cohesion?

On the 9th of June, EFUS organized the 3rd Be Secure Feel Secure (BSFS) dissemination web conference on ICT tools that are at the disposal of citizens and aim to enhance social cohesion and the feeling of security. The event focused on how digital tools can make cities safer by facilitating the involvement of citizens in the co-production of urban security policy.

During this event, Kalpana Viswanath presented Safetipin, and the diverse work done with a gender lens in the spatial realm by using technology and web applications as a tool.

Podcast: Safetipin x Architecture Off-Centre

Kalpana Viswanath from Safetipin and Vaissnavi Shukl from Architecture Off-Centre, engaged in a conversation highlighting unconventional design perspectives, practices, and research projects that reflect emerging discourses within the design discipline and beyond.
