Projects

Safetipin's "Cities for Youth" project data presented at Smart City Jaipur consultation

Safetipin has been collaborating with The YP Foundation, Saarth, Start Up, and School of Planning and Architecture Delhi in Rajasthan over the past year on the "Cities for Youth" project, supported by the Fondation Botnar. The project aims to gather data on what young people, particularly young women, want from cities through large-scale street mapping, youth-led safety audits, and surveys. On February 15th, we had the opportunity to present this data at a consultation in Jaipur, organized by CEO Smart City Jaipur, Mr. Rakesh Meena, and chaired by Dr. G. S. Sandhu, Advisor Urban Development and Housing, Rajasthan. The meeting was attended by various departments, including Transport, IT, and Tourism, who expressed interest in incorporating the data to improve urban infrastructure. Our young advocates also shared their experiences of auditing the city and their safety concerns.



Safetipin provides technical training for 'Citizens for Safe Mobility' fellowship

Ankita Kapoor, Apoorva Nandish, and Toshi Saini recently participated in the 'Citizens for Safe Mobility' fellowship spearheaded by Gender and Policy Lab with **Safetipin** and **Prajnya** as technical and onground implementation partners. As technical partners, our team provided training to the Fellows on conducting safety audits using the My Safetipin App.

The aim of the 10-day fellowship initiative is to engage and educate citizens about urban issues from a gendered perspective while also promoting citizen involvement in the work of public institutions. The selected fellows will be trained to conduct an appbased audit of the safety and accessibility of public transportation infrastructures such as railway stations, bus stops, foot-over bridges, subways, and access roads.





Safetipin and KMVS partner to improve safety in Bhuj through app-based audits

Safetipin, in collaboration with Kutch Mahila Vikas Sangathan (KMVS), a Gujarat-based organization working towards empowering rural women in Kutch, organized an online training workshop to introduce the My Safetipin app as a tool to assess the safety and accessibility of public spaces in Bhuj. Our team conducted the training in February 2023 and introduced the My Safetipin app to the KMVS team and trained them to conduct safety audits using the app. A team of 10 auditors is currently auditing the northern wards of Bhuj using the app in both daytime and nighttime to identify key safety and accessibility concerns in public spaces. We are looking forward to the audit findings and hope to share some interesting insights in the coming months.

The network provides a platform for women from different backgrounds to exchange experiences and connect with each other.
